



'WHO BY FIRE -Leonard Cohen in the Sinai'

Matti Friedman (via Zoom) in conversation with David Leser

To celebrate the release of 'Who By Fire', author Matti Friedman joins us live from Jerusalem.

In October 1973, poet and singer Leonard Cohen travelled from Hydra to the Sinai desert when Egypt attacked Israel on Yom Kippur. In his book, Friedman gives us a riveting account of those weeks in the Sinai, drawing on Leonard Cohen's previously unpublished writing and original reporting to create a kaleidoscopic depiction of a harrowing, formative moment for both a young country at war and a singer at a crossroads.

MATTI FRIEDMAN is an award-winning journalist and author. Born in Toronto and based in Jerusalem, his work has appeared regularly in publications including the New York Times, The Atlantic and Tablet. His last book, 'Spies of No Country: Secret Lives at the Birth of Israel', won the 2019 Natan Prize and the Canadian Jewish Book Award for history. 'Pumpkinflowers: A Soldier's Story of a Forgotten War' was chosen in 2016 as a New York Times Notable Book and one of Amazon's 10 best books of the year.



DAVID LESER is a multi-award-winning Australian journalist and author of seven books, including his memoir 'To Begin To Know', shortlisted for the 2015 National Biography Award, and the recent critically acclaimed 'Women, Men and the Whole Damn Thing', about patriarchy and misogyny in the age of #MeToo. A panel with Kim Slender, Lee-Anne Whitten & Rita Nash

How do we teach hard things like war to kids?

Join Rita Nash in conversation with Sydney Jewish Museum's Lee-Anne Whitten and Kim Slender to look at Holocaust education for school-aged students and how books can be the bridge to understand and explore difficult subject matter. From graphic novels and cartoons, to fiction, non-fiction, and poetry – we explore how books open up the lines for communication and arm parents with knowledge, words and confidence so that they can have these hard conversations with their kids – with books as the key.



LEE-ANNE WHITTEN is a Senior Educator at the Sydney Jewish Museum. Lee-Anne is an expert presenter, facilitator and educator. She is passionate about teaching through individual stories and the transmission of memory from Holocaust survivors. Through her work at the museum teaching young people she has extensive experience with Holocaust texts and stories.



RITA NASH managed an independent bookshop for 13 years after many years of teaching and librarianship in primary, secondary and tertiary institutions. Rita described the process of coming to terms with her Holocaust demons in her story 'The Last Barrier'. She has recently been researching and writing the story of the Polish Jews who survived the Holocaust by fleeing to the Soviet Union. This is her 13th year on the SJWF Programming Committee.



KIM SLENDER is a qualified Registered Psychologist and Family Therapist, and Psychology and Education Consultant for the Sydney Jewish Museum. Through her experience as a school psychologist and working with Holocaust survivors, Kim has significant insight into the impacts of learning about the Holocaust on young people.





MELISSA LEVI has specialised in older people's mental health and dementia for over a decade. She is committed to educating and empowering families to better understand ageing, have big conversations and plan for the future. Her mission inspired 'We Need to Talk About Ageing' and her website Talking Ageing resources she wishes had been available for her own family when her grandfather was diagnosed with dementia.



DR NORMAN SWAN, trained in paediatrics, was one of the first medically qualified journalists in Australia, with a broadcast career spanning more than 30 years. He currently hosts Radio National's 'The Health Report' and co-hosts 'Coronacast'. He also reports on '7.30' and is a guest reporter on 'Four Corners': appears on 'The Drum' and is an occasional host of 'Radio National Breakfast'. Dr Swan sits on the board of the Australian Research Alliance for Children and Youth.



DR ANNE RING is an 81-year-old freelance writer and author of 'Engaging with Ageing: What Matters as We Grow Older'. She challenges the stigma of old age, with a realistically positive approach that acts as a reader's travel guide to navigating how they choose to age. TIM HOLLO is Executive Director of the Green Institute and wrote 'Living Democracy' while a visiting fellow at the Australian National University's RegNet. A musician, environmentalist and community activist, he was the Communications Director for Greens Leader Christine Milne and a board member and campaigner at Greenpeace Australia Pacific. He is the founder of Green Music Australia and has recorded seven albums and toured globally with FourPlay String Quartet.



WENDY FREW is an award-winning journalist specialising in reporting about the environment and sustainability. Wendy has worked in Australia and overseas for several media organisations, including Fairfax, Reuters and the BBC. These days, she's a reporter on 2SER Radio's 'Think Sustainability' podcast.



NATALIE ISAACS is the founder of 1 Million Women, a global movement of women and girls who take practical action to fight dangerous climate change by changing the way they live. Her first book. 'Every Woman's Guide to Saving the Planet' has been published in Australia, the UK and the US. 




















THE JEWS OF KINGS CROSS




